Brilliant fiddler and singer / songwriter **Laura Cortese** is known for her velvety vocals, endless creative energy, and highly visible work as a supporting musician. The San Francisco-born, Boston-based performer has embraced the constant travel of the modern troubadour. In fact, she maintains, it is the people she meets who are her greatest inspiration, including her newest songs. Written in an almost confessional style, Cortese's latest work explores the timeless vulnerability and hope of people in adverse situations. Her

own lyrics may say it best: *"In the dark I would sing a song whispered low...singing for the people in the shadows."*

At home in any number of styles, Cortese has travelled the world as a solo artist and as a supporting musician (on fiddle, vocals, and bass) including appearances with *Rose Cousins*, *The Low Anthem*, *Uncle Earl*, *Tao Rodriguez Seeger*, *Band of Horses*, and – as part of Pete Seeger's 90th birthday celebration at Madison Square Garden – *Patterson Hood* and *Michael Franti*. The variety of textures, styles, and approaches reflect Cortese's own rich musical background. Raised in the trad hotbed of the San Francisco Bay area, Cortese was introduced to music early on, via school orchestras and musicals. That interest was subsequently expanded at the fid-

dle camps and festivals she attended as a teenager, where she developed a keen understanding of and aptitude for various traditional fiddle strains. She attended the Berklee College of Music - where her classmates included Carrie Rodriguez, Casey Driessen, and April Verch. This further fuelled her collaborative instincts and modern sensibilities. Cortese self-released two acclaimed solo albums (2004's traditionally-minded **Hush** and the more personal **Even the Lost Creek** in 2006) and has just released **Into The Dark**, following 3 EPs in the intervening years. Her showmanship, charm and virtuosic technique have made her a favourite among musicians and music lovers alike, at home in New England as well as overseas in the UK, Ireland and Denmark. www.lauracortese.com

Somewhere between the fjords of Norway and the mountains of the Blue Ridge, the fiddle playing of **Mariel Vandersteel** intones strains of elevation, clarity and tremendous feeling on both traditional violin and the Norwegian Hardingfele (or Hardanger fiddle). Laura's trio is completed by the wonderful cellist **Valerie Thompson**.

They will share the bill with B.C. folk / roots powerhouse quintet **Fish & Bird**, who made a memorable Rogue debut last Fall. Led by fiddler **Adam Iredale-Gray** and **Taylor Ashton** (banjo), the band also features **Ben Kelly** (drums), **Ryan Boeur** (bass) and **Valerie Bohrn** (bass). They released their 3rd CD, **Every Whisper Is A Shout Across The Void** in 2011. The two bands will get together for a few tunes as well. www.fishandbird.ca

On stage, 17 year old award winning performer **Kiér**ah - doesn't dance and she doesn't sing but she sure knows how to play the fiddle! After 13 years of classical training (receiving Canada's highest mark on her RCM Performance exam) combined with 12 years of learning and performing Celtic fiddle music... Kiér

ah is a "fiddler extraordinaire". Inspired by the heartfelt playing of Martin Hayes, her own playing radiates the love she has for traditional (and not so traditional) Celtic music - always playing with the clear and precise intonation for which she is known. After spending last summer in Ireland, she was further inspired by the music, the musicians, the history and the kindness of the people - much of which is reflected on her new release - **Stonemason's Daughter**. As a prolific composer, Kiér

ah has published B.C.'s first book of all original fiddle tunes and features 15 of them on her new CD. **A**dam Dobres is a natural born guitarist with a sensitive ability to embody any style of music. From classical, to jazz, to Celtic, he can do it all. He has travelled

all over the world with such notables as *Ruth Moody, The Bills, Oliver Swain, Toni Childs, Daniel Lapp, and Blue Rodeo*. Adam is always energetic and creative in expressing his love of life and music through his guitar.

Kierah and Adam, as well as multi-instrumentalist/producer **Adrian Dolan** really hit it off musically and created **Stonemason's Daughter** - Kierah's second CD. Adam is an amazing guitarist, and did a superb job at making his guitar playing unique to each set. He feeds so well into Kierah's exceptional fiddle playing, and together they create a fantastic, full sound. Taking traditional tunes and combining them with Kierah's original tunes, they give even traditional tunes a current, modern feel. Celtic meets contemporary with this exciting duo!

The Barn Birds

Eilen Jewell is the **Queen of the Minor Key**. Sad songs are her wealth and finery. Lend her your ears, and you will quickly hear why her humble subjects admire and adore her more with each passing year. Since her 2006 debut, **Boundary County**, Jewell has surveyed a wide range of traditional musical styles, from the folk and jug band leanings of her early recordings, through an album-length homage to *Loretta Lynn* and the country gospel of her work with The Sacred Shakers, right up to 2009's **Sea of Tears**, which bristled with the electricity of '60s UK garage rock and Chicago blues. Queen of the Minor Key draws on everything from classic country (the fiddle-driven **Reckless**) to early R&B (the shuffling **Hooked**), with an emphasis on sounds from the seamier side of the tracks. With dirty sax riffs and low-slung guitars, the instrumentals that bookend the album - **Radio City** and **Kalimotxo** - evoke the bump-and-grind exotica of vintage Southern California suburban saloons. Yet on the flipside, Jewell imbues slow, jazzy numbers like **I Remember You** and **Only One** with torch and tenacity that linger long past last call.

"My goal as a songwriter is to always improve," she demurs. "Every time I make a record, I want it to be even more real, more heartfelt, than the one before it. I want the slow songs to be slower and the fast songs to be faster." Drawing on a connoisseur's love of roots music and a writer's eye for detail, Jewell fashions

her musical vignettes with impressive economy. Each turn of phrase and chord change is executed with an élan that belies the measured precision behind it. The title tune takes inspiration from a poke someone made about her harmonic preferences. "I decided to run with that and adopt the moniker, even if it started off as a nickname that wasn't necessarily intended to be flattering." **Bang Bang Bang** eschews the cliché of Cupid as a rosy-cheeked cherub ("he's more reckless and violent than that"), and replaces his petite bow-and-arrow with a gun show six-gauge, plus a laughing disregard for such trivial concerns as aim.

Though its long shadows and dark corners make her kingdom feel intimate, her sovereign domain stretches as far as the imagination. Its denizens seek refuge in padded rooms, abandoned automobiles... and strong spirits. They defend their territory by any means necessary: weird voodoo, sawed-off shotguns, broken bottles. But beware, savvy observer. There is more to Eilen Jewell than meets the ear. Do not confuse the singer and her songs. The drama and darkness that give Queen of the Minor Key its gritty texture are in short supply in the Boston-based songwriter's personal life.



There will be a short opening set by **The Barn Birds: Jonathan Byrd and Chris Kokesh**, two young American troubadours. Here's what one of our favourite critics says about **Jonathan**: *This rootsy North Carolinian may be the most buzzed-about new songwriter in folkdom. He displays John Prine's gift for stark little songs that tell big, complex stories, Guy Clark's lean melodicism, Lyle Lovett's wry mischief, and Bill Morrissey's knack for the revealing image.* - Scott Alarik, *Boston Globe*

Miller/Dermody/Johnson

Johnson, Miller & Dermody have played together for over a decade and a half and this trio has been one of the Pacific Northwest's best-kept secrets until now. All three have busy solo careers but have found time to gather together to play this rootsy, bluesy, soulful music that they love. They sat down at David Lange's studio and played the music found on **Deceiving Blues** all together in the same room, in real time, no headphones, no studio gimmicks, and no attempts to fix things later. Honest, immediate, heartfelt and real, in the tradition of the artists and music that inspired them. They repeated the method with their latest offering, **We Heard the Voice of a PorkChop**. They first played as a trio when all three were on staff at the **Centrum Blues Workshop** in Port Townsend WA. They are known among aficionados of country blues as three of the finest teachers as well as players. With the release of these CDs and more concert bookings across the land, the rest of the world should soon find out what a select group already knows...these artists are three of the finest interpreters and creators of acoustic blues working today.

Orville Johnson is a renowned Blues and Old Time singer, guitarist, mandolinist, dobro player and lyricist with a penchant for the obscure, the wacky and the weird! **John Miller** is a brilliant guitarist best known in these parts for his duet work with mandolinist **John Reischman**. **Grant Dermody** is a stunning harmonica player, who has ac-

companied **Eric Bibb** here in Eric's most recent concerts. Together these three Washington State musicians have recorded two amazing CDs of pre-war country blues and blues-infused originals. Expect to be charmed, entertained, and gobsmacked!

Michael Averill / When Coasts Collide

Fresh off a year of musical adventures touring his puzzle album **What's Life All About?** and a Nepal documentary soundtrack **New Day, New Path, New Legend** in Asia, Europe, and Canada, **Michael Averill**, a quirky globetrotting folk-fusion story singer returns to Vancouver to release his next concept album - **I'd Rather Walk** - a tribute project to his late singer/songwriter father **Garry Averill**, and an endeavor he intends to share with Canadians while walking across the country starting in Newfoundland in August.

A recent serendipitous meeting in an Irish pub in Edmonton opened up a link to his father's past in the Yukon, the place where CBC discovered and recorded Garry in the mid 70's. Garry's first written song **Take The Time**, was selected as a theme for Peter Gzowski's morning show in 1976. This brought forth national recognition and an opportunity to pursue his music. He turned it down, and returned to a quiet life as a teacher with a family. Almost 40 years later, son Michael started performing his father's songs with his own repertoire, and created an album fully inspired by his father's life, influence, and works.

"He was a humorously insightful man who loved to walk," says Michael. "I couldn't think of a better way to honour



that than to stroll across this country sharing our songs and stories."

He'll be rounding out the evening with a folk duo project, **When Coasts Collide**, which he started with Nova Scotia born vocal powerhouse, **Jen Miller**. The pair met in Vancouver almost two years ago as a result of a double booking, and their East/West multi-instrumental folk blend has created quite a stir in the local scene since their official formation in February 2013. **Via Rail** accepted them to perform on the train across Canada, and they'll be embarking on their first joint tour to Ontario and the Maritimes in June.

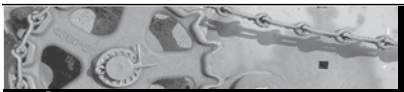

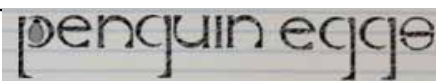
